

Time is Running Out to Stop PennEast!
Public Comment Period Coming to a Close September 12

We need your help in flooding the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) with as many comment letters as possible about its faulty Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) for the proposed PennEast pipeline.

The DEIS is riddled with incomplete and missing information that is required by the National Environmental Policy Act to accurately assess potential environmental impacts of the pipeline.

The proposed pipeline would cut through over 4,300 acres of preserved open space and farmland, and more than 30 of the cleanest streams in the state that feed into the drinking water supply for more than 1 million people. Hundreds of homeowners could have land seized through eminent domain, all for a pipeline that is not needed, according to energy experts.

Before September 12, show FERC your profound opposition to this dangerous, unneeded pipeline.

The DEIS public comment period ends September 12, 2016.
Make your voice heard to FERC!

You should include detailed notes, specific data and unique stories about how you, your family, your community, and your property or business would be negatively impacted by PennEast.

Comments submitted to FERC before September 12 become part of the FERC's legal record and FERC must respond to each comment. Our goal is to submit thousands of substantive, fact-based comments.
