OUR NEW ENVIRONMENTAL CENTER

CAMPERS ENTERING GRADES 1 & 2 FEE: \$315 PER WEEK

Campers have many options to choose! All weeks include lots of outdoor play, exploration, games, discovering our trails, and creative activities! Camp day is 9am-4pm.

STREAM STOMPERS

July 6–10

Cool off with water fun! Enjoy a week full of stream exploration and catching crayfish and other fascinating creatures. We will visit the pond once too!

WIND WORKS

July 13–17

Get blown away by fun this week! Discover how nature makes and uses energy as we explore, build, and play. Make kites and use a solar oven! Our games, crafts, and hikes will be totally energizing!

July 20–24

Get your feet wet each day this week! Catch crayfish, build boats, explore, and create art at the stream and the pond!

Grab your water bottle and let's hit the trail! Learn trail safety and basic survival needs as we roam the Reserve. See some unique places like the Hobbit Tree!

July 13–17

Get charged up by being in the sun! Animals and plants need it and so do we! Harness wind, water, and solar energy to fuel our activities. The sun will even help us cook a special snack!



AQUA-VENTURES

July 20–24

The stream rules this week as you catch crayfish and discover aquatic insects! We also plan to spend a day checking out a different section of the Stony Brook!

SURVIVOR KID

July 27–31 Hit the trail in search of wild adventure! Learn about fire-building, survival and shelter-building as you travel the Watershed Reserve!

Play and create with nature this week! Exciting individual and group projects will help your creativity shine through as you use materials found outside.

WINGS & THINGS

August 10–14

Whooo lives here? Wild and captive critters are our focus this week, from vultures to butterflies, mayflies to turtles and foxes to snakes!



CAMPERS ENTERING GRADES 5 & 6

More weeks available this year! Each week includes an offsite day trip and an overnight on the Watershed Reserve. Overnights are optional and feature special evening activities, tent camping and cooking over a campfire! Camp day is 9am-4pm except for the Thursday overnights.

TRAIL TEAM

July 6-10 \$450

Sharpen your outdoor skills! Practice firebuilding, compass navigation, and plant identification. Then try out the low ropes course, climbing wall, and group challenges on our trip to YMCA Camp Bernie!



CAN-DO CANOE

Join us for water fun every day while we investigate our stream and pond. Sharpen your canoeing skills on our pond before our exciting canoe trip at Delaware & Raritan State Park in Griggstown!

CAMPERS ENTERING GRADES 7, 8 & 9

There are even more choices this year! Each week includes an overnight of 1 or 2 nights, a special trip, and lots of adventure! Overnights include meals. Camp day is 9am–4pm except for overnights.

HIKE IT OUT

July 6–10 \$495 Explore every corner of the Watershed Reserve this week in preparation for backpacking 8.5 miles over two days and one night on the beautiful and historic Appalachian Trail! Overnight trip is Thursday–Friday.



SEE & SHORE July 13–17 \$525

We will spend three days and two nights at Sedge Island Natural Resource Education Center, where we will camp in the Sedge House and go fishing, kayaking, clamming, and bird watching. This unique spot on Barnegat Bay will help us get in touch with aquatic nature including diamondback terrapins, blue claw crabs, and ospreys! Overnight trip is Wednesday–Friday.

POWER PIONEERS July 20–24 \$455

This special week features a biking trip, an overnight on the Watershed Reserve, and an exclusive behind-the-scenes tour of the new environmental center's green systems! Put green engineering ideas to the test as we build boats to cross Wargo Pond! Trip is Wednesday and overnight is Thursday–Friday.






PADDLE POWER

July 27–31 \$525 Ready for the river? Spend three days and two nights canoeing and camping in the Pinelands! As we paddle the Mullica and Batsto Rivers, we may discover egrets, carnivorous plants, and turtles! Overnight trip is Wednesday–Friday.

COUNSELOR-IN-TRAINING (CIT) · FEE: \$235



Choose a two-week program: July 6–17, July 20–31,

or August 3–14; 8:30am–4:30pm

This valuable program is for students entering grades 10 and 11 who enjoy being outdoors and working with children. Training includes natural history, assisting with camp, completing a leadership project, and CIT and parent orientation. CITs will assist with young campers. Gain resume-building experience and knowledge! CITs will be sent additional forms after registering.

Note: CITs who satisfactorily complete their session this summer will be invited back as Senior CITs next summer for no fee (SBMWA family membership required).

WATERSHED NATURE CAMP FAQ

1. What are the dates and hours of camp?

The 2015 camp season is July 6–August 14. Each program runs Monday through Friday. Most are 9am to 4pm, with exceptions for overnights, preschool, kindergarten, and Counselor-In-Training.

2. What is the dress code?

Dress for active outdoor play—shorts, t-shirt, and two pairs of close-toed/hard-soled shoes, including one pair that can get wet. No flip-flops, crocs, any open-toed or soft-soled shoes.

3. Do you serve meals?

No, campers must bring a lunch and two snacks daily. During overnights, healthy dinner, breakfast, lunch, and snacks are provided. Before and After Care campers should bring extra snacks.

4. What do campers need to bring?

Water bottles (at least 1 liter total capacity; 2–3 liters for older campers), a full set of extra clothes, hat, rain jacket, towel, plastic bag for wet/dirty clothing, a second pair of shoes for getting wet (sneakers, rubber boots, or close-toed/hard-soled water sandals), a large bag for everything, and a small backpack for trail essentials.

5. What if it rains?

We put our jackets on and keep exploring! Bring a poncho or rain jacket—no umbrellas. We seek shelter in heavy rain or thunderstorms.


6. What is the staff like?

Camp groups are staffed at a ratio of 7 campers to 1 staff member or better. Staff is primarily comprised of college students and full-time staff. All camp staff members are First Aid and CPR certified, and some possess Lifeguarding and other advanced certifications

- **7. Do you supply insect repellent or sunscreen?** No, campers should apply it before and during camp. Campers must know how to apply their own sunscreen; staff does not apply insect repellent or sunscreen to campers. No aerosol sprays please.
- 8. What about poison ivy and ticks? Staff members are trained to teach campers how to identify and avoid natural hazards like ticks and poison ivy. We recommend that parents also check their children nightly. If you have further questions, contact the Camp Director.

9. What if my child is sick before or during the camp day?

If your child is not feeling well, please keep him/her home and call us to report his or her absence. If your child becomes ill during the camp day, we will call you; early pick up may be necessary. Campers must be fever-free for 24 hours before returning to camp.



Yes, we offer extended care this year for your convenience. Before Care is available from 8 to 9am and After Care is available from 4 to 5:30pm. Extended care is provided by qualified non-camp Watershed staff and offers quiet time for independent activities.

11. How do you use my email address?

Watershed Nature Camp will send all camp communication by email, including registration confirmation and Parent's Guide,

12. What is your refund policy?

Cancellations must be received in writing and postmarked by June 6 for any refund. After that, a refund will be issued only if we are able to fill the vacancy. Vacancies will be filled first from established wait lists. Send written cancellation and request for refund to the attention of the Education Department. There is a \$40 processing fee for all cancellations. SBMWA membership is not refundable.



COME TO ONE OR ALL SESSIONS!

Registration Requires:

- Registration form
- Health and medical form, completed and signed by parent/guardian. New Jersey state law requires that campers submit a current health record each year; please provide written documentation if your child is not vaccinated for medical or religious reasons.
- Full payment by cash, check or credit card (MasterCard, VISA or Discover).

Discounts & Early Bird:

- **Sibling Discount**: Take \$25 off per sibling when attending the same week (\$10 per sibling for preschool and Kindergarten programs).
- Multi-week Discount: Take \$25 off per week per camper when attending multiple
- weeks (\$10 off per camper for preschool and Kindergarten programs). *Excludes Counselor-In-Training*.
- Early Bird Discount: Take \$25 off per camper when registering by April 1.

Before & After Care:

- Before Care: 8–9am, \$75 per camper per week
- After Care: 4–5:30pm, \$100 per camper per week
- If registering for both Before and After Care, fee is discounted to \$150 per week
- Not available for preschool campers
